FRODDO Successfully completes interim Review Meeting in Brussels

The FRODDO consortium successfully held its Interim Review Meeting on 18 February 2026 in Brussels, Belgium, hosted by project coordinator ERTICO – ITS Europe. The meeting brought together the Project Officer, reviewer, and consortium partners to assess the progress achieved during the first phase of the project and discuss the next steps



towards the implementation and validation of FRODDO's innovative mobility solutions.

Funded by the European Union's Horizon Europe Programme, FRODDO is advancing the development of safer, more resilient and intelligent mobility services through Connected, Cooperative and Automated Mobility (CCAM) technologies, Federated Digital Twins, and collaborative transport ecosystems.

The review meeting provided an opportunity for partners to present the achievements accomplished across all project work packages, highlighting significant progress in project management and coordination, stakeholder cooperation frameworks, technical developments, digital twin technologies, pilot preparations, legal and standardisation activities, as well as dissemination and impact creation efforts.

During the meeting, consortium partners showcased the progress made in the development of FRODDO's technical innovations, including advanced positioning technologies, cooperative perception capabilities, digital twin environments, and intelligent mobility services designed to support the future deployment of connected and automated transport systems.

Particular attention was given to the project's pilot activities, with updates presented from the four large-scale demonstration sites located in Ljubljana (Slovenia), Athens (Greece), Modena (Italy), and Bursa (Turkey). The pilot leaders outlined the preparation activities undertaken to date and discussed how the upcoming demonstrations will validate FRODDO's technologies under real-world operating conditions.

The consortium also presented its ongoing work related to user acceptance, standardisation, legal and ethical considerations, cybersecurity, and data protection, ensuring that technological innovation remains aligned with societal needs and regulatory requirements.

In addition, the meeting highlighted the project's dissemination, communication, stakeholder engagement, and exploitation activities, demonstrating FRODDO's commitment to maximising the impact of its results and fostering collaboration across the European CCAM ecosystem.

The review concluded with constructive feedback from the Project Officer and reviewer, who acknowledged the consortium's progress and provided valuable recommendations for the next stages of the project.

As FRODDO moves forward, the consortium remains committed to delivering innovative solutions that enhance road safety, improve transport efficiency, and contribute to the development of a more connected, cooperative, and automated mobility ecosystem across Europe.
